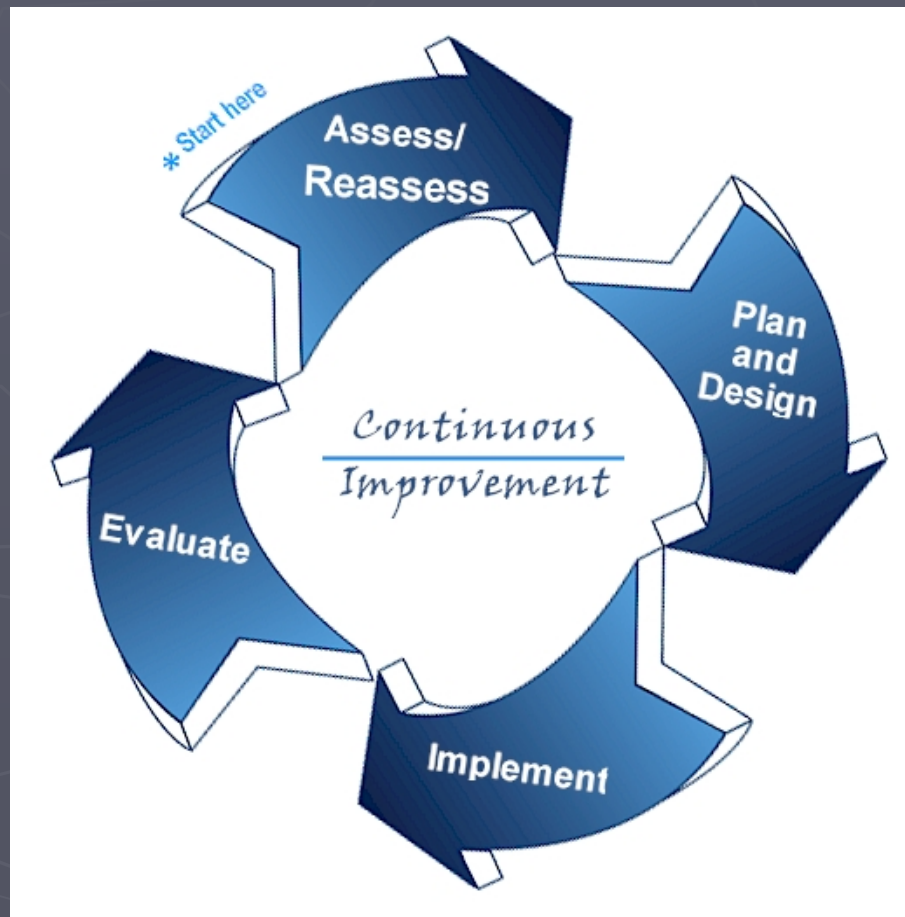


Review of Successes/Problems/Ideas for Improvements



Development of a joint stakeholder relationship and process for new or future Gps or Ips

Development of the GP28 ready for future use
(1.5 yr implementation)

Use of local environmental contractor to provide continuity, local knowledge, permit applications, compliance checks/reports, monitoring, documentation, and continued coordination and updates for trustees and other stakeholders

Need site inspections before during and after to assess permit appropriateness, compliance and need for modification – really an iterative process

Due to Corps policy of minimal compliance checks, a priority scheme should be applied to ensure cases with most potential for impact are included. Also a scheme to beef up compliance checks should be developed to ensure permits and conditions are complied with.

Need early coordination of stakeholders and clear definitions of roles, responsibilities and needs. Appropriate level management should be involved.

Involvement of Corps with local area planning committees and RRTs to build improved long-term working relationships and processes that meet response needs

Need Pre-identification of a Corps response team that can provide continuity, consistency and equal emphasis for emergency permitting requirements so that neither the emergency or normal operations don't suffer.

Permitting process and justification should be consistent – not one way in AI and another for MS. Cross district jurisdiction coordination must be planned for.


There is a need for funding for regulatory program during emergency disasters. Otherwise, they are not prepared to address normal daily mission plus the emergency.

Corps needs inclusion under an ESF or separate appropriation to support the response.

FEMA needs a better understanding of the necessary use and coordination of environmental and regulatory agencies.

Need for more Corps outreach so public and stakeholders better understand the regulatory program. Through this violations should decrease.

Need more State involvement in day to day assessment, planning, and establishment of response priorities and actions.
