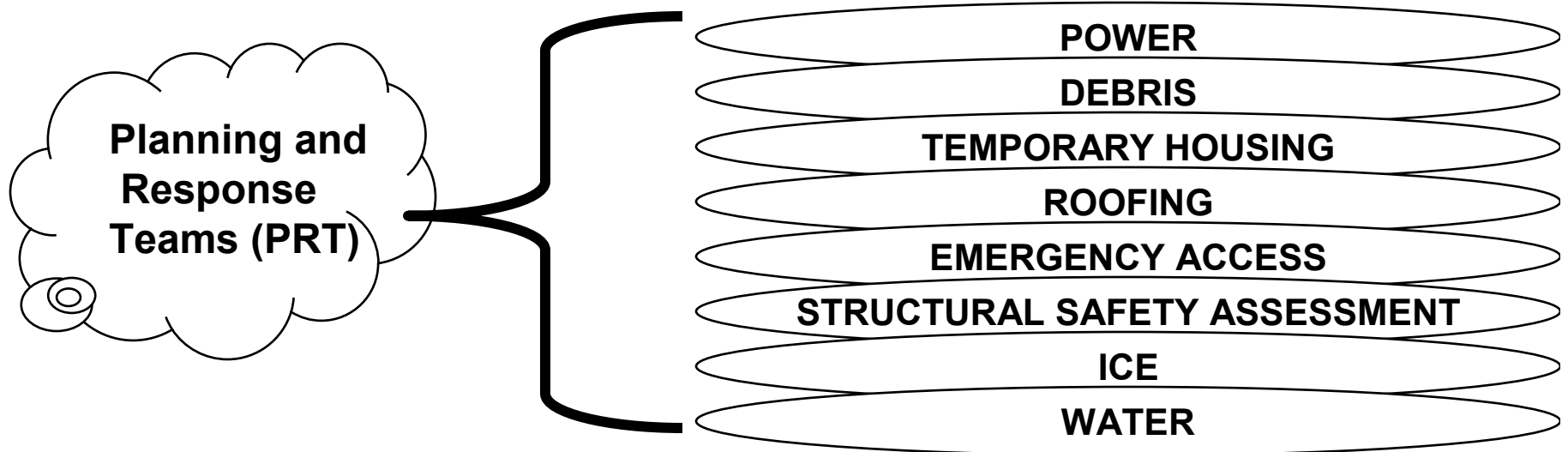

Emergency Support Functions (ESF)

- ESF #1 – TRANSPORTATION – Department of Transportation
- ESF #2 – COMMUNICATIONS – National Communications Systems
- ESF #3 – PUBLIC WORKS AND ENGINEERING – DOD/U.S. Army Corps of Engineers**
- ESF #4 – FIREFIGHTING – Department of Agriculture/Forest Service
- ESF #5 – EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT – FEMA
- ESF #6 – MASS CARE, HOUSING, AND HUMAN SERVICES – American Red Cross
- ESF #7 – RESOURCE SUPPORT – General Services Administration
- ESF #8 – PUBLIC HEALTH AND MEDICAL SERVICE – Department of Health and Human Services
- ESF #9 – URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE – FEMA
- ESF #10 - OIL AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS – Environmental Protection Agency
- ESF #11 - AGRICULTURE AND NATURAL RESOURCES – Department of Agriculture

Public Works and Engineering ESF #3

- PURPOSE. To provide public works and engineering support to assist the State(s) in meeting needs related to lifesaving, life-protecting, and recovery activities.
- SCOPE. Includes technical advice and evaluations, engineering services, construction management and inspection, emergency contracting, emergency repair of water and wastewater treatment facilities, provision of potable water and ice, provision of emergency power and real estate support.



USACE Role in the NRP

Congressional Authorization:

- THE ROBERT T. STAFFORD DISASTER RELIEF AND ASSISTANCE ACT (Stafford Act).
- The **Stafford Act** provides the **authority** for disaster relief operations. The **National Response Plan** is the **mechanism** used by the government to implement the provisions of this act.

USACE Emergency Management Primary Authorities

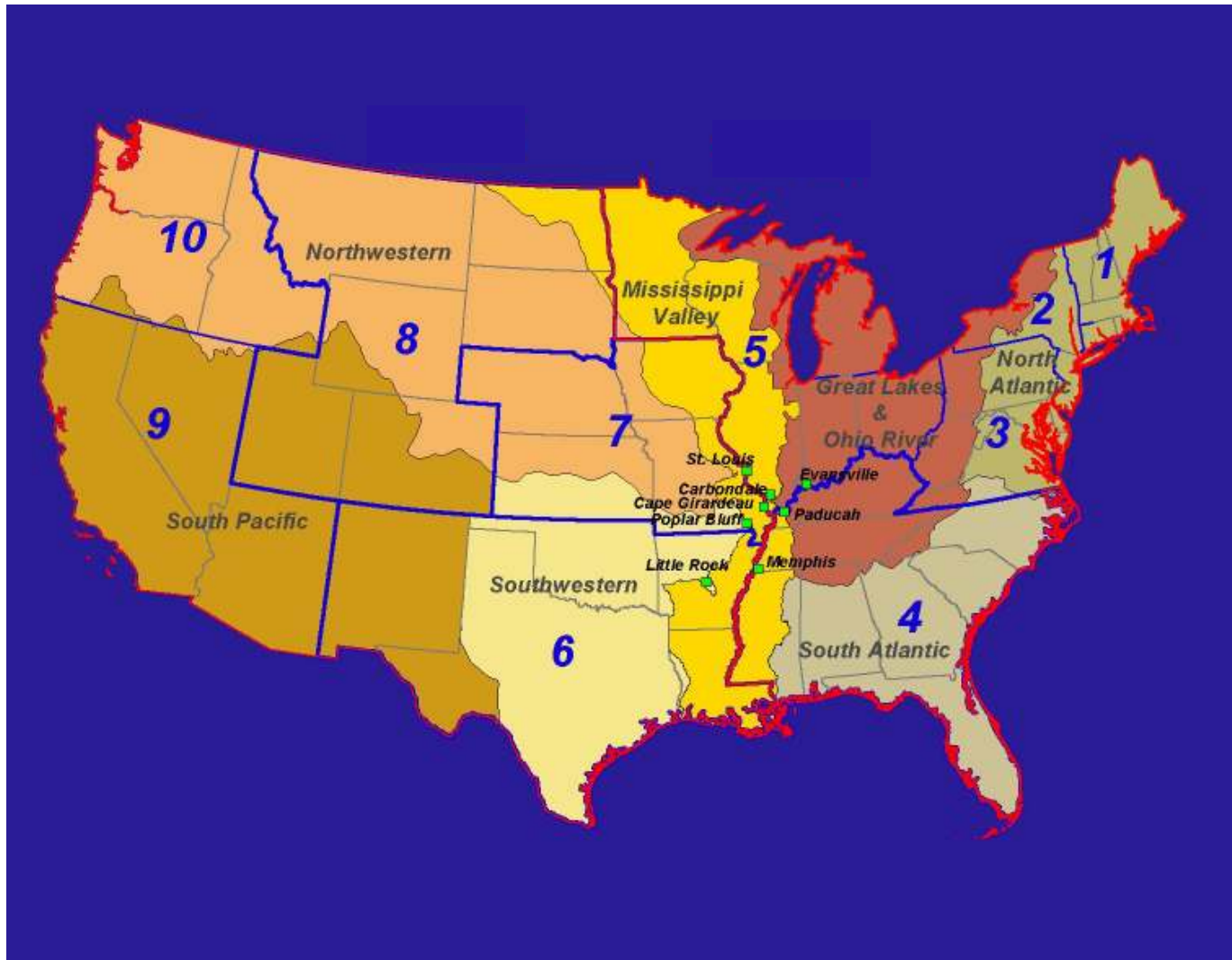
- **AR 500-60:** Commanders have authority to provide in-house resources if other authorities don't apply.
- **PL 84-99:** Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies (FCCE) (33 U.S.C.701n)
- **Stafford Act:** “Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act” provides that federal agencies may be tasked by FEMA to provide disaster response, recovery and mitigation assistance to state and local governments.

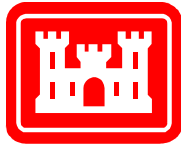
Public Law 84-99

- Disaster Preparedness
- Emergency Operations
- Rehabilitation of Flood Control Works
- Emergency water supply
 - Drought & Contaminated water source
- Advance Measures

Assistance supplements State and local efforts.

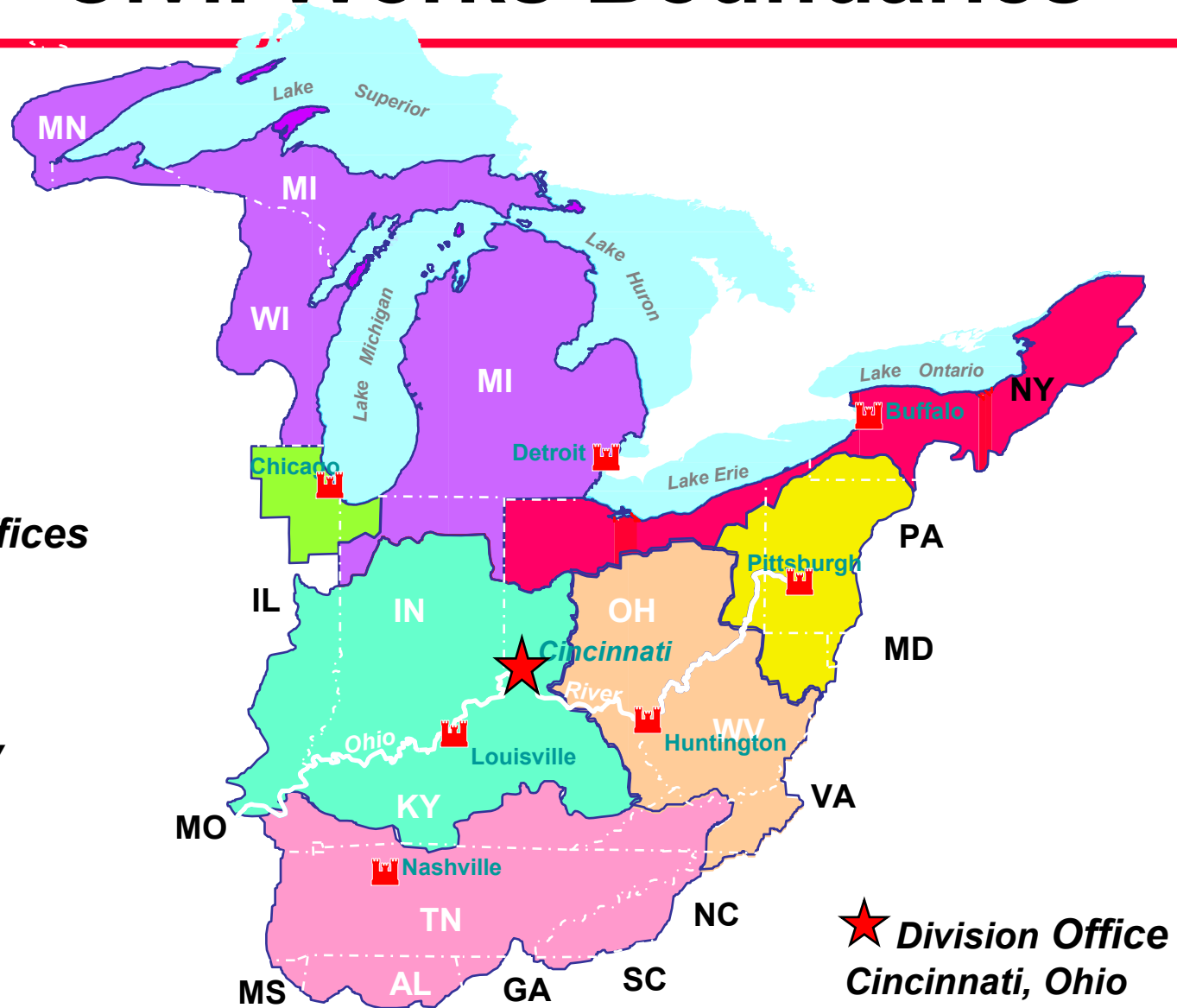
USACE DIVISIONS AND FEMA REGIONS





Civil Works Boundaries

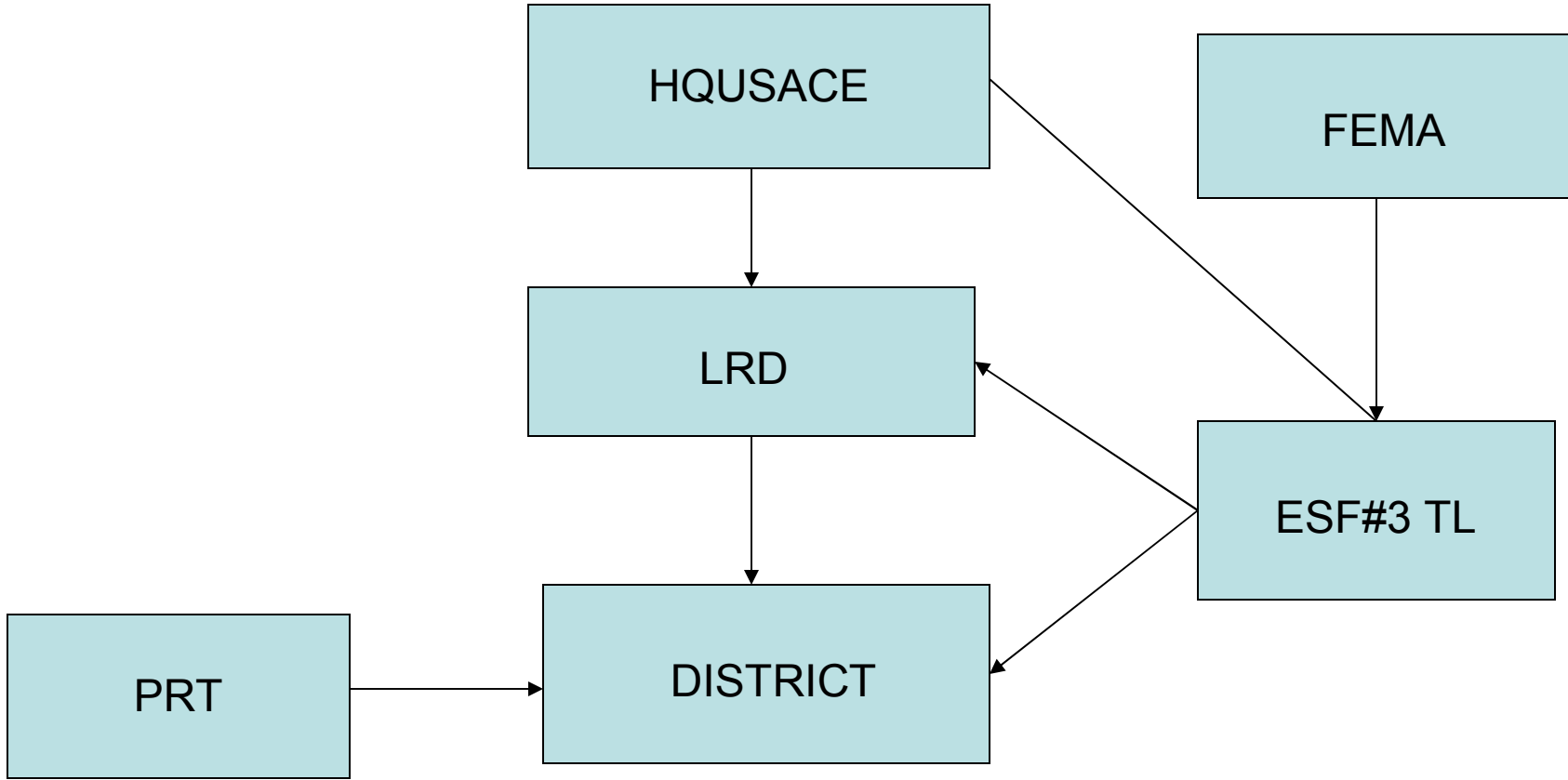

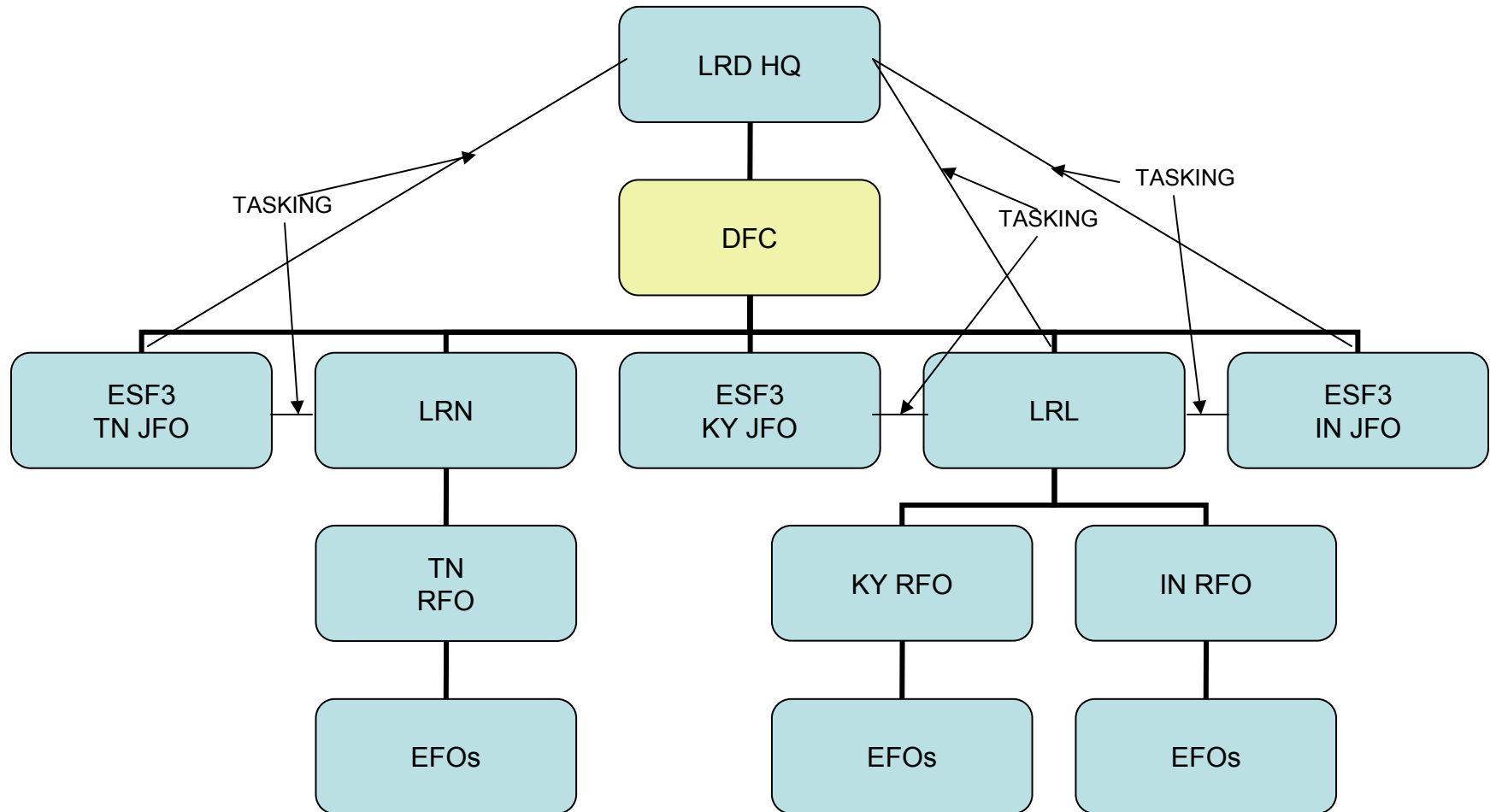
