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## F. Federal, State, and Local Planning and Coordination Efforts

The Chemical Facility Safety and Security subcommittee carried out its mission to develop standard operating procedures for the implementation of Executive Order 13650 in Region 4. The process of development included participation from all three levels of government. Cross training of federal agencies occurred and cooperative inspections were carried out to promote the proper development of the SOPs. The completed products were delivered to the RRT Co-Chairs, Regional Working Group and the National Working Group.

Hattiesburg Derailment Workshop. August 26 – 27, 2015. The workshop included development of multiple plans ranging from Fire management to Operations and maintenance. These were included in the Incident Action Plan. Participants included local fire and police, County emergency management, State and federal agencies and Canadian National railroad. The RRT participated as well with a notification/briefing provided by the command staff.

Southern Exposure 2015 was a full scale exercise for the integration of organizations at all levels of government and demonstrate the ability to coordinate and conduct response and recovery activities during an incident at Duke Energy's H. B. Robinson Nuclear Power Plant.

Principles of Chemical Emergency Preparedness. CEP Training June 29 July 2 EPA R4 hosted this training of a freshly updated course. Participants included representatives from SERCs and LEPCs from across the region. The course provided participants with an understanding of chemical emergency preparedness, and knowledge on of the preparation of chemical emergency response plans.

Considerable activities involving federal, state and local planning and coordination efforts were carried out by the area committees located in Region 4. A summary pf these activities can be found at the RRT 4 website. While these are not activities sponsored or carried out by the RRT standing members, the document points to the extensive coordination of planning and response that is carried out on a regular basis at the area level.
