

- Mercury spill 6/13/2024 Williamson WV, Homeowner found mercury seeping out of the ground in yard. WVDEP responded, contacted the EPA for assistance. Multiple Drums of soil excavated.
- HAM Landfill Tire Fire 8/3/2024 Peterstown WV, Shredded tires at landfill caught fire, WVDEP Responded to assist Local Authorities. Air Monitoring request to EPA for surrounding Community.
