





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Endangered Species Act Consultation Guidance

Enhance the understanding of and create tools to achieve better and more efficient ESA consultations for spill planning and response.

Current focus: Pre-spill consultations- with efforts to develop updated guidance on this subject.

Response Action Matrix: Tool to examine how spill response activities may lead to adverse effects on T/E species and conservation measures to minimize effects.



National Historic Preservation Act Guidance

Review agreement and provide updated guidance on how to achieve compliance with '97 Programmatic Agreement on protection of historic properties during emergency response.


Current status: Workgroup members identified, and initial scope/plan of action developed.



ACP Revitalization Project

Create a new ACP architecture that:

- Differentiates between RCP and ACP components
- >Is organized chronologically (vice ICS)
- Is consistent with NRF principles
- Is more tactical and more streamlined
