



CALLER REMARKS:

ON 2DEC15, NOAA REPORTED TO THE NRC THAT IMAGERY INDICATED A POSSIBLE OIL SHEEN IN THE VICINITY OF THE "COIMBRA", AN OLD SUNKEN TANKER. A NEW IMAGE TAKEN ON 14DEC15 CONFIRMED A SHEEN, AND NOAA BELIEVES THE SHEEN IS EMANATING FROM THE COIMBRA. (DR)

Con Edison Feeder line leak under Hudson River, off Jersey City, NJ (#1606552)

On 10/03/16, Con Edison reported a sheen in the Hudson River due to a possible leak in a feeder line located on the New Jersey side of the Hudson River. A marine contractor working for Con Edison inspected the area and confirmed dielectric fluid was bubbling up to the surface of the waterway near the New Port Yacht Club & Marina, Jersey City, NJ. Containment booms were deployed by Kens Marine and the spill was contained. Result of samples taken at the leak site showed the presence of non-PCB dielectric fluid. At 8:30 PM on 10/04/16, Con Edison declared an official leak due to visible oil on the water surface, and samples that indicated PFT and the identification of a feeder cable oil. The leak rate is currently unknown, however, less than 50 gal of dielectric fluid has been lost as per Con Ed's estimates, since there has been no change in tank levels or pump starts to indicate any significant leaks. A remotely operated submersible (SSO ROV) was deployed by Con Edison and conducted a grid search in the Marina. They observed no soil impact and calculated the water depth at 30 feet. Ken's Marine will continue skimming/on-water recovery



Gas Explosion/Drug Lab/Asbestos Disposal Issues - 300 W 234 St., Bronx (#1606421)

FDNY responded on 9/27/16 to neighborhood complaints about a stove gas leak at the above captioned two story residence in the Bronx. Upon entering the household, they found evidence of a marijuana "grow house". They notified NYPD of the presence of a "drug lab" (and it was sent out as an NYCEM Alert, which was copied to the RSE and others), and went outside the residence. The building then exploded, blowing the roof and most of the upper floor off the building. Battalion Chief Michael Fahy, a 17 year FDNY veteran, was struck and fatally injured in the street by falling debris. 13 other people, including 6 FFs, were also injured. Once it was confirmed that there were no lab pack chemicals from an illicit drug lab to remove and dispose, the issue for DEC then moved to the potential for possible hazardous construction debris waste (asbestos) in the explosion's debris. Two Spill Responders (DeMeo and Omar) were dispatched to the scene to coordinate with the responding agencies and provide direct observations back to the Region 2 office. The Regional Mat. Mgt. Engineer (Ken Brezner) began discussions with his division in Albany on disposal issues. If there are drug lab chemicals that are not taken as evidence (providing there is a drug lab beyond the marijuana operation), DEC Spills would arrange for their disposal via a PIN contractor. NYCDEP conducted an asbestos investigation on scene, and subsequently determined that the only Asbestos Containing Material (ACM) was in the roof shingles, and was not considered a direct hazard, as they were not friable. On 10/4/16, Staff received an update that NYPD crime scene operations have ceased and FDNY has concluded operations at the site. DSNY has completed cleaning of the street and Con Edison has restored gas service to adjacent residences. NYPD will remain on site for security purposes. As there were no petroleum spills at the site and DEC DMM is handling any debris disposal issues, the spill was closed on 10/5/16.
