EPA III NOTIFICATION TO DOI AS A TRUSTEE Oil and Hazardous Substance Incidents

<u>Issue:</u> How do we develop a simple and bureaucratically painless process for EPA III OCSs to provide trustee notifications to DOI?

<u>Justification:</u> NCP Subsection 300.135(j)(1) requires that the OSC/RPM ensure that the trustees for natural resources are promptly notified of discharges and releases.

Challenge: Agree upon an acceptable set of notification pathways whereby DOI receives routine and reasonable notifications. The pathway would be linked to the type and magnitude of incident. THIS IS NOT RRT OR AREA COMMITTEE NOTIFICATION TO SOLICIT DOI ASSISTANCE IN RESPONSE! THOSE NOTIFICATIONS ARE GOVERNED BY THE RCP AND ACP PROTOCOLS DEVELOPED FOR THOSE PLANS.

<u>Decision:</u> Implement the following protocols for a period of one year or until a re-assessment of the situation dictates a change.

A. Oil Discharges outside containment

Actual/high probability ≥ 1,000 gallons

Actual < 1,000 gal.

professional judgement: It is assumed that if the OSC is aware of impacts or significant threats to migratory birds, species protected by the Endangered Species Act, or facilities managed by DOI, that prompt notification via telephone would occur regardless of the general quantity guidelines.
