## Emergency Responses, Exercises and Other Operations FY18

#### 16 Responses

- 8 Oil; tankwagon accidents (gasoline, fuel oil, milk) facilities to water, one historical #6 oil release from old resort mobilized due to area heating, one locomotive derailment-ruptured fuel tanks
  - Mt Washington Hotel in-land area response
- 8 Hazardous substances; ACM, chemical fires, one ammonia, one ricin, typically perform air monitoring

#### Other activations

- Hurricanes Irma, Maria, Harvey & CA Wildfires Next Slide
- 1 Premobilization Boston Marathon
  - 48 AreaRAEs for air monitoring along Marathon route
  - Activated REOC for support and for training Response Support Corps
- Upcoming Vigilant Guard Exercise
  — November 2018
  - Data management and air monitoring support to 4 field venues
  - Activated REOC for support and to train Response Support Corps



#### Disaster Response 2017-2018

- Hurricanes HARVEY
  - 2 Deployments to Texas to support their IMT
- CA Wildfires
  - 2 Deployments
- Hurricane IRMA/MARIA
  - R1 support to Edison, NJ; Puerto Rico; and the US Virgin Islands
  - 161 total Deployments inclusive of all of EPA/R1
    - 3320 support days
    - Equivalent to over 12.8 FTE
    - ER Branch committed 6.4 FTE, or about 33% of field staff FY18 effort

# Oil Program FY 18

- 19 Scheduled Inspections of FRP Facilities.
  - Both FRP and SPCC Inspections
  - 5 Year rotating schedule
    - MA − 10, CT − 6, RI − 2, ME − 1
- Attended 3 USCG led GIUEs



- 5 in MA, 3 in VT, 2 in NH, 1 in ME, and 1 in RI
- 2 Inspections added due to referrals following spills (CT and ME)

  - REOC, 4 field venues and 1 support venue (MEMA)
- December 10: Level A Skills Drill
- TBD summer/Fall 2019: Full scale scenario-based Level A Exercise

- TBD Fall 2019/Winter 2020: REOC/IMT functional exercise





  - 7 Fund Lead/4 PRP Lead
  - 6 In progress/9 Awaiting start
  - Sites Funding:
    - CERCLA \$7.2M
    - Oil \$250k
  - PA/SI & Technical/program funding
    - \$7.2M





- Geographic Response Plans (GRP)
  - Completed in VT, ME, NH and MA
  - Underway in Rhode Island
    - 10 under development on Blackstone and Pawtuxet Rivers
  - NEW funding for Connecticut
    - New GRPs for FY19 planning is underway
    - · Site selection meetings for
      - Naugatuck River
      - Housatonic River



#### Projects and Initiatives


- CWAPWG planning to have unclassified briefings on NTAs and FGAs for next RRT meeting

  - Three mobilizations in 2018











